MISSION

The **Neuro Day Team** is dedicated to assisting individuals with neurological impairment (Brain injury, Stroke, etc) maximize their abilities and reintegrate themselves into society. Our team consists of highly motivated therapists who will work closely with individuals through specialized therapy programs

GOALS

- Improve quality of life, with emphasis on return-to-work, school and community.
- Maximize independence in activities of daily living.
- Improve cognition and communication.
- Facilitate return to recreational/leisure activities to the fullest extent possible.
- Maximize mobility skills and physical accessibility to the environment.
- Facilitate emotional and social adjustment to an acquired disability.
- Formulate a realistic plan for return to vocational and/or educational settings.

INTERDISCIPLINARY TEAM

Our therapists are specifically trained in the evaluation and treatment of neurological impairments. Individualized treatment plans are developed to meet participant's short and long-term goals, and are communicated through team and family conferences. Our team consists of:

- Program Coordinator
- Case Manager
- Neuropsychologist
- Physical Therapist
- Occupational Therapist
- Speech-Language Pathologist
- Psychiatrist &/or Referring Physician

The participant, family and funding source are also active members of the interdisciplinary team. Their input is important when developing goals and careplans. The Primary Care Physician (PCP) is an important team member as well and will receive updates on a regular basis. The PCP is also consulted routinely on medical issues requiring specialty referrals.

PROGRAM

Participants may be scheduled to attend individual and/or group therapies from **two to five days per week, for three to six hours per day** as deemed appropriate by the treatment team. Activities often include community outings with staff, as well as family education sessions. Length of stay in the program is dependent upon individual rehabilitation needs and progress toward goals.

Additional services may include:

- Balance Disorders Program
- Functional Capacity Evaluations (FCE)
- Incontinence Therapy (Bio Feed Back)
- Job Trials
- Onsite Job Evaluations
- Brain Injury Support Group or Stroke Support Group
- Vocational Counseling
- Facilitating Return to School including Individual Education Plans (IEP)
